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The CAS Program

SIS recognizes the importance of developing all abilities within each student and has designed the CREATIVITY, ACTION, and SERVICE (CAS) Program to do just that. Students are provided opportunities to develop their abilities in each of these areas *outside* of class or work. The work may take a variety of forms, but it must be done individually for people from outside of the students' immediate family, and without monetary compensation. All students must complete a *minimum* of 100 hours of CAS projects during their high school years to satisfy the CAS graduation requirement and these hours must be recognized and approved by the school.

Advanced Placement Exams

In May 2021, 122 examinations were written by 41 students in grades 9-12. Over 85% of students achieved a score of 3 or higher. Scores of 4 and 5 made up 36% of all scores.

In 2021, SIS had 7 AP Scholars, 3 AP Scholar with Honors, 10 AP Scholars with Distinction, 8 AP Capstone Diplomas, and 4 AP Seminar and Research Certificate issued.
